

Station 4 - Protestant Municipal Church

1861, 40 protestant families asked for financial help for an own construction of a church. As a result, through the complete German empire people donated for the oldest reformed community.

The church is built in neo-Gothic style with a spiky tower. The interior is held undecorated, like it corresponded to the spirit of the Calvinistic shaped congregation of Landstuhl of that time.

Over the entrance of the front hall, a red sandstone relief with the crest of Sickingen was immured, which probably stems from the second half of the 16th century and which is from ruin excavations of the former palace Nanstein.

The pointed arches of the pre frontal side windows show symbols of the four evangelists, the back ones remind of Martin Luther, Johannes Calvin, Philipp Melanchthon and Franz von Sickingen.
